Preventative Maintenance Isn't Scary

All to often people hear the words "preventative maintenance" and instantly get a little scared...typically because they lack basic automotive knowledge. In lieu of us dressing up for Halloween and attempting to scare you, this issue of the Olson Marketing Monthly newsletter is focused on solving potentially scary preventative maintenance problems with Amsoil.

Here is a list of some basic preventative maintenance tasks all vehicle owners should consider doing at least once a month.

- * Check and top off all fluids (Engine Oil, Transmission Fluid, Power Steering Fluid, Coolant, Brake Fluid, Windshield Washer Fluid)
- * Check all lights, interior and exterior.
- * Check tire pressure and tire condition.
- * Clean/blow out air filter
- * Check battery terminals for corrosion.
- * Properly clean and protect the interior and exterior of your vehicle.

Some people just get sick when they begin thinking about tackling the issue of preventative vehicle maintenance by themselves, but I assure you, it is nothing to get nauseated about.



With some basic knowledge we will provide for you in this newsletter and a few <u>Amsoil</u> Products, you will be able to overcome your fear of preventative maintenance and show your friends a few tricks. Perhaps they will even make you some delicious treats.

auto always Teaching shop brought new problems to my door step. One of the most common problems with vehicles 10 years and older is that the weather-stripping* around the doors cracks and breaks off leaving the door to not seal very well creating water leaks and excessive road Unfortunately, Amsoil noise. doesn't make a product to "grow" new weather-stripping, but they do have a product that will keep your weather-stripping in "new" condition.

Applying a generous amount of Amsoil Silicone Spray to all rubber weather-stripping around your doors, hood, and trunk will ensure it does not dry out, crack and break off. I recommend doing this once every three months. Not only can you apply it to the weather-stripping, it works great for anything rubber, nylon, plastic, upholstery, vinyl, wood, cardboard, fiberglass and other nonmetal surfaces. It even works great for waterproofing boots, shoes, jackets, suede and more.

According to repairpal.com/estimator, it costs between \$212 and \$302 to replace one injector in my truck. And I have 8 injectors. I am a thrifty person and I would much rather spend about ten bucks for a bottle of P.i. every three months then replace one or more injectors.

I treat one full tank of gasoline with one bottle of P.i. and I do this once every three months. Not only am I cleaning the inside of my engine, I am also getting great gas mileage.


Wiggle Test

In a vehicle, many computer system failures, especially intermittent failures, are caused by loose, dirty, or corroded connections. These failures can be found by performing a wiggle test, or "flex" test.

To perform a wiggle test:

- 1. Connect a scan tool to the vehicle and choose the appropriate test option. Refer to the instructions provided with the scan tool.
- 2. Place the vehicle in the key-on/engine-off diagnostic mode.
- 3. Flex wires and wiggle harness connectors while scanning for problems.
- 4. If wiggling a wire or connector produces a new diagnostic trouble code, check the wire or electrical connection more closely. It may be loose, corroded, or damaged.

Some technicians perform a wiggle test while the engine is running. If engine operation changes suddenly (stalls or idles high, for example) when a connector or wire is flexed, the problem is located at or near that point. Be careful when performing a wiggle test on a running vehicle.

Shop Talk

As the temperature begins to change and get colder, I have found that vehicle batteries are more prone to failure. This past week I parked my truck in my driveway after work and went inside for a few hours. As the sun began to set I decided to pull my truck into our garage. When I turned the key, the engine struggled to turn over. Up until this point I have had no problems with my battery but I knew that it was nearing the end of its life.

Most batteries are guaranteed by the manufacturer to last 3 years, and if you take care of your battery it is not uncommon for it to last 5 years. Beyond 5 years of age, it is really hit and miss if the battery will continue to function properly. Over the years I have heard a few people having a battery last 10 years, which is very uncommon. Most often, a battery will fail between 5 and 7 years of age. My battery was 5 years and 1 month old.

Preventative maintenance on batteries includes cleaning off corrosion around the battery terminals with baking soda and water. Cleaning the case of the battery to prevent voltage leakage, and checking the battery electrolyte if you have a serviceable battery.



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
