The video below reminded me of the importance for always making sure you are using the best quality products that offer the best protection available.






Inspecting Your Cooling System

The coolant, or antifreeze solution, should be checked and changed at regular intervals. After prolonged use, coolant will break down and fail to do what it was designed to do...protect your engine from overheating. It can loose its rust preventative and corrosion resistant properties causing the cooling system to rapidly fill with rust and become corroded.

A visual inspection of the coolant will help determine its condition. Rub your finger inside the radiator filler neck or reservoir tank. Check for rust, oil (internal engine leak), scale, or transmission fluid (leaking oil cooler). Also, find out how long the coolant solution has been in service. If coolant is contaminated or too old, it should be replaced. The "finger in the radiator filler neck" trick is a good way to perform a quick inspection. Just make sure you do this while the engine is cold or hot coolant may spray all over you.

If you are like me and want to be more thorough than a visual inspection you can use <u>Amsoil</u> <u>Antifreeze Test Strips</u>. These test strips will allow you to test all





types of coolant (ethylene glycol as well as propylene glycol). Using the test strips you are able to test for both boil-over and freeze protection as well as the pH level of your coolant.

Fortunately you don't have to be a chemist to undertake this simple check. Just follow the video instructions (by clicking on the picture above).


One other suggestion I have is to switch from conventional ethylene glycol coolant (the green or red stuff), to <u>Amsoil Propylene</u> <u>Glycol Antifreeze</u>. It's low-toxicity limits threats to children, pets and wildlife. Additionally, it provides extended protection beyond conventional Antifreeze.
